RIF Reading Is Fundamental

It was mentioned at the DKG Board meeting that many of our new members are not informed about the RIF program. Since this is our main project, it was suggested that some background of our RIF project would be a good idea. The following is what the RIF Coordinators are sharing with all the teachers and principals on the first distribution day.

Reading is Fundamental (RIF) in the Monterey Peninsula Unified School District

- K-3 students in six schools (Crumpton, Del Rey Woods, Highland, King, Marina Vista, and Ord Terrace) receive free books three times each school year
- Over 1900 students receive books Over 5700 books are distributed each year
- When 4th and 5th graders were added last year, over 2700 students received books
- Volunteers (retired teachers, librarians, community, and parents) read to all students in K-3 three times a year
- All special needs students are also included in both the reading and distribution of books
- Program is funded by Reading is Fundamental and the local Delta Lambda Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, with support from Macy's

At the first distribution students in 4th and 5th will also receive a free book, along with all the students in K-3. This is thanks to the extra 2500 books given to us by Macy's and RIF. We also anxiously await word from RIF and Macy's to hear how many books we are given from the Macy's Share Program this summer.
