A wonderful cookie baker, she contributed continuously to Sunday morning coffee hours and many other special occasions at Church in the Forest and to many other organizations to which she belonged. We would find her working at fundraisers for our chapter every year. Her time,

Tootie was so committed to helping others and being involved and counted on for these contributions that it kept her active all of her life to the very end of it on earth. It was the spark that kept her going, as well as her friends, by her example.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

The Delta Kappa Gamma Society was founded on May 11, 1929, at The University of Texas in Austin, Texas, by Dr. Annie Webb Blanton. Dr. Blanton conceived the idea of an organization for women educators. The founding group of twelve women educators represented a cross-section of the teaching profession: a grade school teacher, a dean of women, three high school teachers, three elementary school principals, and four college professors. The Founders believed that there was a need of an organization in which women educators might be united for efforts toward better professional preparation, recognition of women's work in the teaching profession, and scholarships for those needing aid in improving their professional preparation. The 5th purpose (of our Seven Purposes) states: To endow scholarships to aid

outstanding women educators in pursuing graduate study . . . At our meeting on August 25th, we said that we would get scholarship information out to you, so if you are interested in pursuing a scholarship, here is the information that you need:
