Michael and I met in high school and, although I preferred stage managing to acting, we performed together in school plays. Theater has been a force in our lives. Around two years ago, Donna Bessant, Michael, and I formed the Off the Rack Production Company. We staged Nora Ephron's warm and witty last play, "Love, Loss, and What I Wore" to great success at the Carl Cherry Center for the Arts. Didn't see it? Your chance will come again in 2016.
