There was no business meeting so there are no minutes. Here is a recap of the gathering: Donna Bessant led us through a game focused on RIF, DKG, and Mardi Gras, all three having a history of community action.

Focus then was on three philanthropic areas Delta Lambda supports.

Marsha Leadingham and Stephenie Meroney, our **RIF** leaders, said we have begun distribution at the six schools we support. We touch the lives of around 3,000 students, TK – 6, through books and stories. Each distribution costs around \$13,000.00 so Marsha and Stephenie will apply for a grant. Through photos, they recalled 2009 when Barbara Sovereign received national honors in Washington DC as Volunteer of the Year.

Betty Aynaga, our **STEP** chair, told about the three ways we support teachers:

- 1. We award grants of up to \$500.00 to four or five new teachers, based on their applications.
- 2. We give gift cards to our members who are working teachers.
- 3. We have an Adopt a School program for acknowledging all the teachers in our community, or as many schools as we can reach.

Gail Boger mentioned that we also give financial support to **Girls, Inc.**, the organization that teaches girls how to be smart, strong, and bold. We have much to be proud of!
