Legacy, Future and What's Important Sixty-five years and counting "forward moving ever"

Delta Kappa Gamma, like a diamond, has many facets. There are the 'six purposes' and then there are subtle individual takes on what membership means and why each individual decided to join the organization.

The purposes:

- unite women educators in fellowship
- honor women who evidence potential for distinctive service in education
- advance professional interest
- initiate, endorse, and support legislation in the interest of education and women educators
- to endow scholarships to aid women educators
- stimulate personal and professional growth of members and appropriate programs of action



Over the years there have been modifying changes and/or expansion of existing programs as society and needs have changed. I don't think that the original founders would have used the recently added wording that 'membership is open to individuals who identify as female', yet that adjustment now exists.

There have been changes and modifications to Delta Lambda's interests and focus as well. Support of Reading is Fundamental, teacher morale, education of underserved students, student extra and co-curricular education, participation in the organization's greater programs.

As we celebrate this 65th year, it is a good time to look at what is of importance or value to most of us. At the last meeting we had a JamBoard,' and some of us shared what individuals felt was important. We all like, need, appreciate different activities, programs, needs – so 'sprss yourself'.

Norma Voth's Presentation at Our January Meeting In Memory of Barbara Sovereign

"We remember Barbara Sovereign, who was a Delta Lambda member since 1983 and who touched us in many ways. She was kind, gracious, and genuinely cared about what was happening in other people's lives. She was reticent about sharing details of her own health struggles, but she always had time to listen to other people talk about their lives.

Barbara was above all a superb educator. She was a Reading Teacher not only in MPUSD, but also in private schools. She willingly volunteered her time and talents to make life better for others. All of us in DKG were aware of her love of RIF and the many hours she spent making sure that the program not only survived, but became better because of her dedication and commitment. Barbara and Connie Lynch took over RIF when Jim and Joan Hull stepped aside. Then in about 2003 or 2004, Katie Kelly took over as a coordinator with Barbara. She and Katie worked tirelessly for several years, organizing the six schools for RIF Days. This included getting all the volunteers, ordering the books, transporting the books to the schools, planning the days with each of the six school principals, and filling out stacks of paperwork that was required. When I took Katie Kelley's place, it was suggested that to make this an easier task, there should be a coordinator at each of the six schools. What a great idea (Thanks, Donna). Barbara was also involved when Macy's started the program to support the RIF program nationwide. Summers at Del Monte Shopping Center and travels to other Macy's stores in the area were always a joy for Barbara. Thanks also to the many DKG members who helped to support this program. All of these efforts on behalf of RIF were rewarded (although Barbara thought she was not worthy) when she was one of three nationwide RIF volunteers who won the Volunteer of the Year Award in 2009. This included an all-expenses paid trip to Washington, D.C. which culminated with meeting the RIF staff and a banquet honoring the three national winners.

This is a lot about RIF, but Barbara also volunteered in many other organizations during her life including at her church, the Monterey Public Library and other educational organizations. At her memorial service which many of you had a chance to attend, either in person or by livestreaming, it was beautiful to hear and see her grandchildren, children, and husband speak about her and her life. It was obvious the love that she had shared with all of them in her life and the impact that she made on all of them. It was a lovely tribute to a very special lady who is and will be missed by so many of us.

In addition to all her other wonderful gifts, Barbara had a subtle but puckish sense of humor. A few weeks ago there were eight of us sitting around a dinner table. Most of us had been educators, and we got around to telling some of our favorite stories about experiences in the class room. Barbara listened intently to our stories, but she didn't contribute one until one of us asked her. She thought for a moment and then told us about working on reading with a little boy. She noticed from his chart that his birthday was coming up the next week. She asked him when his birthday was, to which he replied that he didn't remember. She said that it was coming up soon and then told him the date. The little boy got very excited and exclaimed, "That's the same day it was last year!" Among all the other memories I have of Barbara, I will always remember her warm laugh, her gentle spirit, and her kind heart. My wish for all of us is that we will carry the memory of Barbara Sovereign with us tomorrow, and the day after, and the day after that. She taught us a lot about how to live our lives—if we were listening.

A big thank you to Mike, Barbara's husband, who would like to contribute to our RIF program in her name. He is willing to match whatever funds we donate in Barbara's name to keep the RIF program alive and flourishing. Now, it's in our hands; let's contribute what we can to make our RIF program one that Barbara would love, one that is thriving and making sure that we get books to all those wonderful and deserving students in our RIF schools. Thank you, Mike, for your very generous offer. Barbara would be so proud and happy."
