## **New Teacher Recruitment Grant**

Delta Lambda awards New Teacher Recruitment Grants to students enrolled in a teacher education program. This year a \$500 grant was awarded to **Kenya Solis**, a CSUMB student who co-taught in a second grade classroom at Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary. Guided by a quote by Ayesha Siddiqi, "Be the person you needed when you were younger," Kenya aspires to be that person to all her students. She is determined to make them feel seen and feel that they belong. This fall Kenya will teach at Bay View Elementary.

## Penne Ferrell Award



Each year DKG California selects a limited number of first, second, and third year applicants to receive a Penne Ferrell monetary award to finance the cost of books, e-books, or other reading materials intended for a classroom library or to supplement curriculum. **Jada Kranig,** recommended by Delta Lambda member, **May Higuera,** is a first year teacher

at Marina Vista Elementary, and became one of the recipients of the award. For her first graders, she purchased books that are accessible to her English Learners and connect with their cultures and languages; she purchased early reading chapter books to challenge her students; and she purchased books highly requested by her students.

A bequest to Chi State from the estate of Penne Ferrell was the basis for the establishment of this award. Penne was an outstanding member of Epsilon Omicron Chapter in Orange County. A dedicated teacher and lover of books, Penne instilled the joy of teaching on the many new teachers she mentored, always encouraging enthusiasm in being an educator.
