Meet the Board Members

Marilynn Whitcomb

My roots are in the sands of the Coachella Valley, just over 100 miles south east of Los Angeles, CA. My first eleven years were spent dodging rattlesnakes, making snowmen out of tumble weeds, building forts in mesquite trees, sitting in front of the swamp cooler in the middle of the summer, and swinging on a swing set that my dad built out of irrigations pipes with my younger sister and two brothers. My backyard had a view of the desert as far as one could see in the little town of Mecca. No, not that Mecca--Mecca, California.

For my second eleven years we moved up the desert about 15 miles to Indio where I attended junior high and high school. My high school years were highlighted by two successful years on the debate and speech team, traveling around the state competing with other high school teams. Then it was off to college in San Diego at a beautiful little campus, then called California Western University, overlooking the Pacific Ocean on Point Loma. The first year I majored in boys, getting straight A's, however my academic classes did not fare so well, so I had to switch my major, and settled down to a major in Sociology and minor in Physical Education. I never considered being a teacher during my college days.

During college I met my first husband, Bruce, and it was his job offer to teach at Carmel Middle School that brought us to the Monterey Peninsula in 1969. During my first year here I was at loose ends about my career, and was convinced at a party one night to volunteer at Carmelo Elementary School in Carmel Valley. I was intrigued watching the impact the teacher was making on the students, and realized I too could make a difference. While my first marriage did not last over the years, my love of teaching did. I spent 36 years as an employee of the Monterey Peninsula Unified School District. During that time I became politically active, serving two terms (twenty years apart) as Monterey Bay Teachers Association president, and many years on the negotiating team. My passion for teaching, mostly fifth and sixth graders, was matched only by my passion for helping new teachers. In 1986 I was selected as a mentor teacher to create a program for assisting new teachers in MPUSD. The new teacher program turned into the Beginning Teacher Support and Assessment (BTSA) program, and in 2000 I reluctantly left the classroom to become the first full-time BTSA coordinator for MPUSD. Somewhere in the middle of all that, I met, and eventually married, the love of my life and terrific travel partner, Michael.

In 2006 I retired from MPUSD and began working (part time) with California State University Monterey Bay, supervising student teachers. I currently supervise 10 student teachers at Ord Terrace and Del Rey Woods. As my husband tells me, I have failed retirement.

What I have not failed at is my love of travel, highlighted by adventures to Bhutan, Myanmar (Burma), the island of Sulawesi in Indonesia, the mountains of Peru and Machu Picchu, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan, the island of Reunion, African safaris in Kenya and Tanzania (climaxed by a climb to the top of Kilimanjaro), the islands of Palau, and getting married in the Seychelles.

While our travels have taken us to some of the most beautiful places in the world, we feel so fortunate to come home to Pacific Grove and our dog Misha.

What Do We Do With New Members After We Recruit Them?

The traditional time to recruit additional new members has been at beginning of the fall season. Now the emphasis for new members will continue throughout the year. Keep recruiting.

New members are very enthusiastic soon after joining and their decision to remain with an organization is typically made in the first few months. What does this tell us? Get members involved early! Below are tips and ideas will assist you in new member retention and engagement within your Chapter.

Focus on new members. Your Chapter needs to let new members know that they are special and that their membership is appreciated.

- Welcome each member personally. This can be done by a phone call from a designated Chapter member, mentor, or member of the membership committee. This helps the new member feel appreciated.
- Contact the new members personally twice within the first two months. Why twice? Once is nice, but twice is impressive.
- Provide a membership kit or brochure highlighting club information, opportunities for involvement and activities.
- Provide new members with a history of the Chapter, previous Newsletter issues, past actions taken, and other useful information.

- Be patient! New members may have a steep learning curve and will need time to adjust.
- Smile, be friendly, and get to know the new members. Have fun!

New Member Involvement: Research tells us two things: 1) people like to be asked to volunteer and be involved, so personally ask them, and 2) when individuals get involved in the activities of your organization, it is less likely they will drop out. Be careful not to equate involvement with leadership. It is unlikely all your members will be involved at that level, therefore think of involvement as participation in activities, as well as leadership in the Chapter.

Invitation to meetings; encourage attendance. Just as with involvement, members like to be asked to attend meetings, particularly early in their membership. New members may need a bit of encouragement to attend a meeting or function since they're not yet familiar with the Chapter or its membership.

- Give some form of appreciation to those who get involved.
- Every time a person gets involved in your Chapter, someone needs to say, "Thank you!"
- Personally acknowledging individuals during a Chapter meeting is a great way to show appreciation, as is including their names in the Chapter newsletter. (Not all seek public recognition, but everyone likes to at least be thanked for their efforts.)
- Don't wait until the end of the year to give awards and thanks to those who were involved.

Reason for joining? Try to identify as clearly as you can why people are joining your Chapter. Keep track! Be sure to understand what benefits members want as they are joining and reinforce those benefits early in their first year of membership. Finally, remember that all Chapters, particularly ones involving their new members, work best in an atmosphere of respect, communication, and meaningful involvement.
