# Delta Lambda Welcomes Four New (highly talented) Members

At our recent Zoom meeting four new members were introduced. Below you will find a brief description of their many contributions to education as well as their many talents. We are very excited to welcome these four exceptional educators to our local Delta Kappa Gamma chapter and look forward to learning more about them in the future.

#### **Anne Congleton**

Most of Anne's educational experience has been at the primary level at Ord Terrace, teaching both first and second grade. Her highlights include: Serving as a member of the Monterey Peninsula Unified School District leadership team focused on learning new initiatives and plan for site level training with the other members of the Ord Terrace leadership team. She was the grade level lead teacher on the Ord Terrace Leadership team for about the last 5 years. She served as one of the founding members of the social emotional learning team, which led to the first Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) teams in the district. She created family nights for reading, science, and math, which provided the opportunity for families to participate in fun learning with their children and members of the community. Finally, she has been a California State University Monterey Bay cooperating teacher (master teacher) to several student teachers.

#### **Rochelle Davis**

Rochelle's extensive educational background centers around the performing arts and sensory motor development. Highlights include: Teaching children's performing arts classes overseas. Master teacher for the use of movement sensory motor development and dance. She delivered presentation of teaching techniques to improve student's concentration, focus, and eye-tracking to improve reading skills. Served as a trained Scoliosis examiner and developed exercise remedial therapies for children diagnosed with Spinal Curvatures. She organized a conference in Jerusalem, bringing Palestinians, Jordanians, Yemenites and Israelites together in "Education for Peace" Conference. Led dance programs and theater arts programs for pre-school through high school students including All Saint's Day School. She received the American Red Cross Award for extraordinary personal action for using lifesaving skills that saved a toddler from drowning. Self-published a "Handbook for Stress Management."

#### Victoria Lucido

In her eyes, Vickie has spent "a lifetime in education" as a student and teacher. In the teacher role she has spent 33 years at Fitch Middle School (now Seaside Middle) and Colton Middle School teaching English, social studies, leadership and drama. Highlights include: During the many years teaching at Colton Middle, Vickie was often asked to be the "voice" for Colton. With so many administrative changes at times, it was comforting to the teachers to be able to look to Vicky for leadership. While she first advocated against the K-8 configuration that eventually happened, she grew to enjoy having the "sweet" little ones at the school. Vickie recently retired and quickly went to work completely an already popular book "Classroom Confidential How I Survived 33 Years In Public Education." She has received many awards including recognized seven times by "Who's Who of American Teachers, Monterey Teacher of the Year in 1999, Mildred Willemsen Excellence in Teaching award in 2011, named "Art Hero" by Monterey County Office of Education in 2018, and most recently the Colton Middle School stage was dedicated to her in 2018 and is now called "The Victoria Lucido Stage". She directed and performed a one-woman-show Pretty in Hollywood at the Wharf Theater in Monterey. Lastly, she and her husband Frank have formed The Lucido Band donating their musical talents to charity fundraisers. Sounds perfect for a future Delta Lambda event.

#### Valerie Rivera

Valerie is just finishing up her 17<sup>th</sup> year with the Monterey Peninsula School District almost all of those years at Seaside Middle School (formally Fitch Middle). During that time she taught classes in the areas of English Language Development, English, History, Theater, Mexican Folk Dance, Visual Art (2-dimensional and 3-dimensional, ceramics, and digital art) and film. Highlights: She served as the Associate Student Body advisor for several years, and was the first Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) lead for the school. She is currently the advisor for the student equity team as well as serving on the Instructional Leadership Team. She has served on several district committees, which include the superintendent's council for Dr. Diffenbaugh, budget team under Superintendent Shepherd, ELD team, vapa team, and district equity team. She is the proud recipient of the Mildred Willemsen Excellence in Teaching award in 2008 and also the recipient of the Bill Walsh Memorial award for writing teachers from the Carmel Authors and Ideas Festival (now the Pebble Beach festival) in 2008. She has been a long time member of both LULAC and NAACP and is a member of the California Art Educators Association and National Art Educators Association. She is currently working on her National Board Certification in art. Finally, she is a visual artist and flamenco dancer. Again, sounds perfect for a future Delta Lambda event.

### In Memoriam Leslie Geyer 8/8/1939 - 5/18/2020



Leslie Geyer passed away peacefully in her sleep on May 18 with her son and daughter near just after midnight.

Leslie was born in Sumatra Indonesia where her father, Lester Geyer, managed the Goodyear rubber export/import to the United States. They escaped before the war broke out and moved back to the US where her mother, Jessie Geyer, bought a lemon ranch in Carpenteria, California.

A few years later they settled in Carmel where she served as Junior class president and graduated from Carmel High.

Leslie attended USC where she met the love of her life, Gerry Mowat, earned a BA and later 2 MA's. They lived in Alhambra, California where she taught high school English literature and had two children, Tracy and Charlie.

She later moved to Santa Barbara, California where she hosted numerous charitable and social events. She worked at Hughes Aircraft Santa Barbara research as a Buyer of high reliability materials for their spacecraft payloads, a training coordinator training others how to buy, and an HR

retirement benefits counselor. She was enthusiastic about the symphony and the arts, particularly Oriental arts. She was Chairman of the Board for Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic.

After returning to Carmel, consistent with her lifelong goal of learning something new every day, she entered the digital age and was Director of the Library Media Center at Salinas High. She was a member of Delta Kappa Gamma, a national honorary teaching association. Leslie was a fierce advocate for the vulnerable and was actively involved with Legal Services for Seniors, Coalition for Homeless Women, and American Red Cross Disaster Relief. She was twice the head of 210 volunteers at the AT&T Golf Tournament.


Leslie was an avid world traveler with five trips across the US by car, nine trips to Europe, four trips to Asia, including six weeks in India by herself. She traveled to Africa and Australia and participated in several medical/humanitarian missions to Haiti, Guatemala, Honduras, and Russia.

Leslie had a big heart, and her mission was always giving back through service to whatever community she lived in. She was involved in more social and charitable groups than are able to be mentioned. She received many awards for her service. More than all the work she did though, she was a good friend with a bold, infectious laugh, who loved a good party, had a great sense of humor and always saw the best in people. She had the heart of a lifelong learner and of a mentor to other women. Everything she did, she did with excellence, always striving, with her enormous capacity to make things better. She will be dearly missed by all who knew her

She is survived by her two children, Tracy (an ultrasound technician) and Charlie (a pilot for United Airlines); three grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Penne Ferrell Award: Each year Chi State selects a number of first, second, and third year applicants to receive a Penne Ferrell monetary award to finance the cost of books, e-books, or other reading materials intended for classroom library or to supplement curriculum. Alyssa Mah, a second year teacher at Del Rey Woods, was this year's recipient of \$200. She plans to purchase "a diverse range of books, including bilingual books, and culturally responsive material" to meet the needs of her students. Alyssa Mah was also a prior recipient of Delta Lambda's New Teacher Recruitment Grant in 2018.

A bequest to Chi State from the estate of Penne Ferrell was the basis for the establishment of this award. Penne was an outstanding member of Epsilon Omicron Chapter in Orange County. A dedicated teacher and lover of books, Penne instilled the joy of teaching on the many new teachers she mentored, always encouraging enthusiasm in being an educator.

**Outstanding Student Teacher:** This year Delta Lambda nominated Chandler McKean to represent our chapter. We are pleased to announce that she has gone forward to represent Area V as Outstanding Student Teacher to compete for the Chi State title. As The Area V representative she received \$150.00.
