Meet the Board Members

Gayle Paul

I was born in Idabel, Oklahoma. My parents followed my father's family to Oregon when I was nine month old. We lived in southeast Oregon until I was 7, at which point we moved to Adin, CA, a small berg of 500 people in the northeast corner of the state.

I attended a K-8 school with combination classes through the 8th grade. Our high school consisted of students from 4 small communities and averaged 125 students on the entire campus! I received my B.A. from Chico State followed by an M.A. from San Francisco and an administrative credential from the University of Santa Clara.

I had a long career in MPUSD (36 years) that included ten years of teaching in the classroom in grades K,2,3,and 5, eight years as a reading specialist and 18 years as an elementary school principal. I had the unique opportunity to serve as the principal at Crumpton when it was a K-2 school. With the closure of Fort Ord I was asked to transform Crumpton to a K-5 environment. After 4 years, I was assigned to open Marina Vista and with half of my staff and student body joining students from Marina Del Mar. I began my final ten year adventure with MPUSD. I had the opportunity to work with amazing staff and enjoyed getting involved with my children and their families.

My major passion in life has been traveling which was probably planted in my brain with the yearly Route 66 trips to visit my grandparents in Oklahoma, and possibly influenced my decision to go into education. During the past 40 years, I have visited all 50 states and traveled to 6 continents and 55+countries. Travels have also included walking the length of the Thames River (185 miles) in England. I was fortunate to marry my husband, Jonathan in 1979 who shares my lust for traveling. He is also a pilot which has added another exciting layer to the experience.

In addition to traveling, retirement has enabled me to volunteer at the Cooper Store in Monterey. I am thoroughly enjoying sharing the history of Monterey with fellow travelers and local citizens. The peninsula is such a special place and I feel so privileged to live here.

Carolyn Palmer

I was born in Merced, CA but moved to Oregon when I was three months old. I spent my teen years as a camp counselor in Walnut Creek, CA (Palmer School which was founded by my aunt and uncle and currently run by the third generation with a fourth in the wings). That experience solidified my career choice.

I majored in Elementary Ed. at Oregon State University eleven miles from home. Then in 1969 I surprised everyone by traveling more than 600 miles to teach in MPUSD. 36 years flew by as I taught 3rd, 2nd, and 1st grades at Marina Vista, Hilltop, Patton, and Marina del Mar.

I retired in 2006 and hardly looked back, though I did volunteer at school for several years. Currently I take Gentrain classes, put labels on newsletters for CalRTA (retired teachers), deliver flyers for Pac Rep, bag and tag bears for Teddy Bears with Heart, and help out with RIF. After shelving books got a bit too hard I am now cleaning books in the children's room at the Pacific Grove library. In February I started with author 'H' (because a table was nearby) and now I am on 'P'. Slow work for sure, but it's fun to see the children and parents come in and today I got to listen to the toddlers' story hour. How cute!

Life is not all work. My cousin introduced me to Letterboxing, I try to exercise regularly, and I joined a knitting group where I have mostly worked on needlepoint and counted cross stitch. There is usually a stack of books to read and no real need to set the alarm clock any more.

Reading Is Fundamental

We just received a letter from RIF informing us of our Macy's SHARE allocation for all your hard work in July! This year they are giving us an allocation of books and not dollars. We will order the books directly from them but will be given a choice of titles. This process will begin in January. Our allocation is 6,154 books! We usually give out a total of 6000 books to our students in the six schools each year and spend less than \$2.50 dollars per book so this number of books translates to over \$12,000. Last year we received \$9000 from the Macy's SHARE program.

Starting with the next RIF distribution in February or March, students in fourth and fifth grades will also receive a RIF book. They will also receive a book in the third distribution. Hopefully we will be able to do this again next year.

A big thank you to Macy's and thanks again for all your help for making this distribution possible.

The Penne Ferrell Fund Award Guidelines

A bequest to Chi State from the estate of Penne Ferrell was the basis for the establishment of this award. Penne was an outstanding member of Epsilon Omicron Chapter in Orange County. A dedicated teacher and a lover of books, Penne instilled the joy of teaching in the many new teachers she mentored, always encouraging enthusiasm and excellence in being an educator.

Who is eligible to apply for the award and how often?

- A non-Delta Kappa Gamma member
- A woman educator who is in her first through third year of teaching and who may become a prospective Delta Kappa Gamma member
- A teacher is eligible to apply once a year if she has not been a prior recipient

What does the award fund?

The award will be used to finance the cost of books, e-books or reading Apps. These reading materials are intended for a classroom library or to supplement curriculum. The recipient may receive an award for an amount up to, but not exceeding, \$200.

How are applicants notified after applying?

When the award application is approved or declined, the applicant will be notified by email from the Chi State Early Career Educators Committee.

Application Process

- Download an application from the Chi State website at www.chistateca.org
 - On the home page, select "Deadlines and Forms"
 - Select "Penne Ferrell Fund"
- Email the completed application to the Early Career Educators Committee (chistateece@gmail.com) by <u>December 1</u>
- The Early Career Educators Committee will review the application and determine the eligibility of the applicant
- If approved, the recipient will receive a letter of recognition and be funded in a timely manner
- Recipients will be acknowledged at the Chi State Convention

Delta Lambda is the local chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, one of the largest organizations of women educators in the world. Our mission is to promote professional and personal growth of women educators and excellence in education. The Delta Lambda Chapter will be holding a silent auction at its fundraising event on January 30, 2014 to benefit the following projects aimed at promoting literacy in our community.

Reading is Fundamental (RIF) is the oldest and largest children's nonprofit literacy organization in the United States. RIF's highest priority is reaching children in kindergarten through 3rd grade. All RIF programs combine three essential elements to foster children's literacy: reading motivation, family and community involvement, and the excitement of choosing free books to keep. The members of Delta Lambda raise money to purchase books for six elementary schools on the Monterey Peninsula. Delta Lambda volunteers read to every kindergarten through 3rd grade class at these six schools and assist the students in selecting a book to keep as their own.

Girls Inc. is a national organization that provides programs focused on leadership and self-empowerment for girls ages 9 to 18. Girls Inc. of the Central Coast benefits from the grants given to them by our chapter. Each year, Delta Lambda provides the funds to send two incoming high school freshmen girls to the Smart Choices Summer Program at CSUMB. This program helps local girls pursue higher education, explore their potential for leadership, and make smart choices for a future of great possibilities.

Grants-in-Aid provides help to new teachers for their classrooms. Each year, Delta Lambda awards grants of approximately \$500. to four new teachers in our area.

Many businesses and organizations throughout the county and the state have donated items for our chapter's annual fundraiser which is held every January. We hope you will consider helping us with a donation. Together we can make a difference. We look forward to hearing from you soon.
