#### Chatter from Cathy




We had a great time at the December meeting (who knew that Latvia was the home of Christmas Trees?) – thank you to the wonderful committee that put it together!!

#### 1 - Go to the International DKG website: dkg.org

The number is on your membership card - yes, you have to find your card

(I wrote my number on a page with my membership numbers in NEA/CTA/etc)

Our Chapter Treasurers also have access to our member numbers

#### 3- You will need to enter your password.

If you have never created a password for dkg.org, follow the prompts

#### 4 - Once you have access, click on "MY DKG"

If you had already entered some information, your name and address will appear

#### 5 - To enter information, or update information,

Click on the 'Pen' icon and a text block will appear - start writing


