
As the process unfolds further, updates will be sent via email.



"Forward Moving Ever" Thoughts on Legacy By Cathy Findley



As we think about celebrating 65 years of Delta Lambda and just a few years away from the 100th anniversary of Delta Kappa Gamma, we necessarily think about those brave women founders, what they did, what they had to do, why they needed this organization and why we do too.

In the '50's, teachers had to sign Loyalty Oaths, stop teaching when they became pregnant, and had to follow a dress code of dresses, hose and heels. Many teachers were employed without a college degree – and wanted one. They needed the support of others to make positive changes to their profession and personal growth.

"Duty....staunch and courageous" These daring women were proud of their profession, knew the importance of education for the betterment of society and democracy and wanted to share with others.

"Mindful of our sisters needing" those secure women were leaders who offered other women help in pursuing their education and other interests.

"Aid and guidance", they mentored others, shared ideas, offered smiles and cared for others in their schools – educators and students alike.

"Onward! Tis our sisters need us" – We must remember that those in our chapter need help (working, retired, or somewhere in between) and the educators in our schools need support as well.

65 years is NOT retirement age, it's a time to think of how we can help next with "Courage, Faith and Honor". With the examples of women we have never met and the learned, powerful, vigorous, solid women in our chapter, we will continue to heed the need of educators and offer guidance. Our chapter will "Firmly Stand" another 65 years — with steady determination to "Move Forward."

Barbara Sovereígn October 13, 1937 - December 30, 2021 Monterey, Calífornía

Barbara Jane Wolf Sovereign was born to Mary Jane and Kenneth Wolf on October 13, 1937, in Yonkers, New York. On Barbara's 9th birthday, her family, including her older brother Bob, moved by train to La Grange, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago. In their new neighborhood, Barbara and Bob found plenty of playmates and activities.



Barbara graduated from Lyons Township High School and DePauw University in Greencastle, Indiana, and is a loyal member of Delta Delta Delta Sorority. Barbara met her future husband Mike at church and they attended their high school senior prom together. Their romance continued through college; it helped that their colleges were only 90 miles apart. In the summer of 1959, after their baccalaureate graduations, Barbara and Mike were married in the La Grange Presbyterian Church.

Barbara and Mike moved to Lafayette, Indiana, where Mike could attend graduate school at Purdue University while Barbara taught elementary school in nearby Delphi. Their son John was born soon thereafter and their daughter Susie was born 14 months later. As the children started growing up, Barbara managed their home and served as a Brownie and Webelos leader, PTA board member and Presbyterian youth leader.

After completing his doctorate, Mike took positions at the University of Illinois and the Pentagon before joining the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School. The family followed him to Illinois, Virginia and finally California in 1970. Barbara and Mike have maintained residence in Monterey ever since. Mike's sabbaticals gave them the opportunity to live in Holland, Hawaii and Washington, D.C.

Before Barbara went back to teaching, she became involved with several local groups, including AAUW, Tri-Delta Alumnae Panhellenic Association, the Monterey Presbyterian youth groups, the Lyceum and I-HELP. A group of lifetime friends formed, mostly from AAUW, who enjoyed playing bridge and long walks — they became affectionately known as "the Broads."

Barbara taught in the Monterey schools for 19 years, mostly as an elementary reading specialist. Barbara received her Master's in Reading from La Verne University in 1978. After retirement, Barbara became involved in Reading is Fundamental, affiliated with the Delta Kappa Gamma educational sorority, and co-chaired the group for several years. Barbara received a Reading Is Fundamental national volunteer award in 2000.

In retirement, Barbara and Mike travelled abroad and in a small RV up and down the West Coast. Two grandchildren, Zachary and Alia, arrived soon after their retirement and they enjoyed more time with them in San Francisco and Monterey.

Barbara survived a long battle with cancer and died peacefully at the end of 2021, supported in love by her husband Mike, son John, daughter Susie, brother Bob (Maurice) Wolf, many nieces and nephews and grandchildren Zachary and Alia. Her family thanks Dr. Nancy Rubin and the excellent staff at Pacific Cancer Care for their kind attention.

A memorial service will be held at the First Presbyterian Church of Monterey on Sunday, January 9, 2022 at 2 p.m. Only family and very close friends are welcome to attend. The service will be livestreamed, and information about this will be forthcoming.
